



Youth Activities and Peer Support Internship (North London)

Role Description

1. To assist the Project Worker and Project Coordinator to plan, prepare and run a weekly mixed youth group for young refugees and asylum seekers in Neasden and holiday and weekend activities, locally and around London.
2. To assist the Project Coordinator to plan, prepare and run the peer support project for young refugees and asylum seekers in North London.
3. To work with the Project Worker and Project Coordinator to contribute to monitoring and evaluating the outcomes of the Rise Up Project
4. To assist the Project Worker and Project Coordinator with a range of office and administration tasks as agreed
5. To attend project planning, team and debrief meetings as agreed with project staff
6. To work with young people to plan and facilitate activities, such as sports, cooking, crafts or outings.
7. To take part in setting up activities at start of sessions.
8. To take part in clearing up and evaluating activities after sessions end.
9. To report any problems, accidents or concerns to project staff
10. To read, understand and agree to Young Roots' child protection/safeguarding policy.
11. To attend and take part in training as agreed with your manager.
12. To attend and take part in supervision meetings with your manager every month
13. To inform project staff immediately if you are unable to attend one or more session or if you will be late.
